Okay guys - here is my attempt an inspirational letter to prompt more dues-paying members. I have often found it effective to put this kind of letter in my voice, from my perspective. So I would like your feedback but I will do any editing myself, okay? Thanks.

Patty's thoughts on our tradition(s)

After in 2016 sending her one of her own three long letters called Perspectives 1, 2, and 3 (2010). She answers: Thank you for posting these. I am always amazed when I read my writing that I actually wrote it. It seems better than I could do, & I actually learn from it!

Many of Patty's writings, old and new filed in the unofficial "Legacy Holder Library Container," with topics of her like:

- 1. The history of Legacy Holder group;
- 2. Cultivating Ch'I: Article in the Tai Chi press Volume II, No IV, written with Edna Brand;
- 3. Role of an apprentice (not just) teaching;
- 4. Ph 4/app work/PH levels/Level 8, QiGong, spiral breathing;
- 5. The Levels: just dogma or not (with precise reference to accomplishments on each level of PH)
 - Changing the curriculum is a very daring thing to be doing, needing understanding how that changes the Path to Enlightenment that has been created. There must also be the courage of responsibility, to dare to go forward and develop what's needed, and trust the Barakath to keep us on target.
- 6. Hawaiian work:

Lomi and Cleansing (Mihiki, cleansing*) both align and heal, freeing our body's structure and energy, as well as our Mind and Spirit, by relying on the same principles as Tai Chi. Both Lomi and Hula have Warrior applications. In knowing how to align the body and joints, these can also be temporarily misaligned, to capture and disable an aggressor. The lower part of the body rotates rapidly around the tantien, while the upper part is left free to work with the elements, such as fire."

- 7. Doing the Form backwards (no), QiGong backwards & in both directions (possibilities and exceptions)
- 8. The core of our work is always twofold, yin and yang:

- 1. To decrease and get out of the way of force and negativity,
- 2. Promoting healing and a positive outlook on all levels, even for our attackers whoever they might be.

Although it's not Tai Chi, the Native American perspective of the Lakota tribe is so like the Taoist perspective! A very yin spirit work. And a woman started their healing and shamanistic work, including the pipe the sweat lodge, the Sundance and many other ceremonies that put us into real reality, being both animal and spirit children of this planet. I learned the saying "humanity is one spirit" from my father when I was a child. I was amazed to find it in Arica! It is a part of the Lakota perspective - the word Lakota means "the people" - all people. One people, one spirit. Another phrase is "if you kill someone you kill yourself".

We need everything we can come up with to change the perspective of the t-45* supporters. Tai chi is one thing, & communicating w/o negativity is another.
